Questions for Conversation

Icebreaker: What is your favorite memory of sitting around a table.

- Read Revelation 19:6-9. Spend some time talking about what this event will be like? How does it make you feel and what questions does it cause you to ask. Then, talk about why it is important that your Life Group and you personally are actively trying to find ways to invite people to Jesus.
- To close out your Life Group, take communion together.
